Wine Survivor is an Erin Rotary Club fundraiser. A portion of the 2023 Wine Survivor proceeds will support East Wellington Community Services to improve transportation services for local seniors and other Rotary community projects.

Our commitment is to ENERGIZE ERIN which means we cultivate a better community for all who live in and love Erin. We serve, support and promote our community without hands, energy, and fundraising activities.

PRIZES - Total Value up to \$4000

At the end of the game, the first-place winner takes home 72 bottles of wine. There will be 9 other prizes as follows: 2nd-48 bottles, 3rd-24 bottles, 4th-18 bottles, 5th-10 bottles, 6th-7 bottles, 7th-5 bottles, 8th-3 bottles, 9th-2 bottles & 10th-1 bottle.

In addition there will be a consolation prize of 1 bottle of wine to the 1st ticket drawn on each night of the draws.

HOW WINE SURVIVOR WORKS

You buy your ticket to participate in the Wine Survivor Lottery. This ticket allows you to join 299 other people on Wine Survivor Island. Total tickets available are 300.

Once the game begins (Monday, November 27th, elimination draws begin and approximately 10 percent of the participants are randomly "voted off the island" each evening. Draws will be conducted at 5418 Eighth Line, Erin or 9335 27 Sideroad, Erin.

Daily elimination draws will be held at 7:30 pm each weekday night. The last draw to determine the main prize winners will be conducted on Friday, December 8th.

A daily email indicates who got voted off, everyone else is still in the game. A Zoom link to view the draw will be provided to ticket holders.

If you are voted off, you are no longer eligible for the main prizes. But, you may still be one of the lucky winners of a consolation prize! The first ticket drawn on each night of the draw will be awarded a consolation prize of one bottle of wine.

HOW TO PLAY

Click here to Register now. Tickets are limited so do not delay as we only have 300 places on the island. Otherwise ticket sales end on November 24th. The lottery is open only to residents of Ontario who are 19 years of age or older.

PAYMENT AND DROP OFF

Once you have registered, you will receive an email with instructions on how to e-transfer your entry fee. Once we get your money, you will get your ticket number to get onto the Wine Survivor Island. Your portion of ticket will be mailed to you and the draw portion will be added to the lottery drum.

General Information:

Ticket Sales campaign: October 23–November 24, 2023

No tickets will be sold after midnight on November 24, 2023, and the draw will proceed based on the tickets sold as of that date.

The Wine Survivor Lottery is open only to participants who are 19 or older. The ticket purchaser must be physically present in the Province of Ontario at the time of purchase.

The price of the ticket to participate in the draw is \$40. Total number of tickets to be printed: 300.

Draws:

Elimination Draws start 7:30 pm, November 27, 2023
Final Draw 7:30 pm, December 8, 2023
Number of draws: 10 (weekdays only)

Elimination Draws will take place at 5418 Eighth Line or 9335 27 Sideroad, Erin, ON. The Final Draw will take place on December 8 at 5711 Second Line, Erin, ON. All draws will be live streamed and video recorded for transparency and integrity. The Zoom link will be provided to all ticket holders.

Winners' names will be published on the Erin Rotary website.

Total Value of Prizes: \$4,000.00 (based on 200 bottles of wine valued at \$20 per bottle.)

Consolation Prizes

Awarded to the holder of the first ticket drawn each night – 1 bottle of wine each.

Ticketing:

All ticket sales will be conducted online. Interested participants will register using the online registration form. Once registered, participants will be emailed with instructions to e-transfer their entry fee to erinrotarywinesurvivor2023@gmail.com.

Once the e-transfer has been accepted, the participant will be advised of their ticket number by email. The paper portion of their ticket will be sent by Canada Post mail to their provided address. The draw portion for that ticket number will be placed in the drum. Both portions of the ticket will include the unique ticket number and all the information specified in the AGCO Raffle Licence Terms and Conditions.

Erin Rotary will create and maintain a spreadsheet to track paid participants. The e-transfer payment will be linked to the corresponding ticket number.

Draw Procedure:

This is an elimination draw. For each ticket drawn, the holder is "voted off the island."

The committee will send the launch email (BCC all ticket holders) on Monday, November 27, reminding everyone that the draws begin that evening.

Beginning on November 27 and over ten draws, tickets will be drawn from the drum until the final draw on December 8. During the final draw, tickets will be withdrawn until only ten Survivor tickets remain. The remaining ten Survivor prize winners will be awarded prizes following the Prize Schedule. The last remaining ticket will be the First Prize winner.

Each weekday evening at 7:30 p.m., we will draw up to 30 tickets from the raffle drum. This number may be adjusted depending on the total number of tickets sold, such that approximately 10% are drawn each night.

A Consolation Prize of one bottle of wine is awarded to the holder of the first ticket drawn each night.

Staffing:

Colleen Kelly and Don Fysh are members of the Rotary Club of Erin and oversee and are responsible for the raffle's conduct.
